WHAT IS PROJECT SEARCH

Project SEARCH is a unique, business-focused, one-year, school-to-work transition program for young adults with disabilities. Selected students will participate in three hands-on internship rotations at a professional host business site in combination with classroom instruction on employability skills. Participants will work with a team that includes their family, a rehabilitation counselor, host business mentors, and onsite Project SEARCH staff to create their employment goal. The team will also support the student during their transition from school to the workforce.



ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Age 18-22
- Have an IEP or 504 Plan
- Referred by a participating school district
- All graduation credits complete
- Strong desire to work 16 or more hours per week after program completion
